Project Summary	The topic idea is communicated clearly and concisely. A sample walkthrough of the day describes your current thoughts on teaching the class. Planning	There is an itemized list of pieces and knowledge that the student will need to research or create for their teaching day.	The list is unclear or incomplete.	Only a cursory effort has been made at planning for this topic.	5
